Childminding services

The Supreme Court will pay the cost of your childminding services provided the following conditions are met:

1. You are responsible for the normal daily care of the children.
2. You are attending court in the following capacity:
 - witness in a civil, criminal or appeal hearing
 - party in a civil hearing
 - party in an appeal hearing
 - defendant in a criminal hearing.

The Court will pay for child care on the days that you are required to attend Court only. The centre must be **licensed childcare facility** as referred to in s.12(2)(c) of the *Child Care Services Act 2007*.

You are responsible for making bookings, placing and collecting the children and knowing the business hours of the childcare provider.

You must inform the child care provider on a daily basis of the date and times that you are required to attend court and the date and times that child care is required.

Payment options

1) UNPAID INVOICES:

- Forward the unpaid invoice to the Court
- Payment will be made by credit card preferably or an EFT

2) PAID INVOICES:

- Forward a copy of the invoice to the Court
- A copy of the receipt for this invoice **must** be attached
- Provide your BSB Account details for reimbursement by EFT
